Vaccinations

Prior to travel, travelers should be up to date with the age-appropriate routine vaccinations recommended by their home country. Travel-specific vaccination recommendations are noted below as appropriate.

Yellow fever

- Entry requirement: travelers from specified countries; additional conditions apply
- Recommended for personal protection: some travelers

All Travelers: COVID-19; Hepatitis A; Influenza

Most Travelers: Typhoid Fever

Some Travelers: Chikungunya; Hepatitis B; Mpox; Rabies

Details

Travelers' Diarrhea

High risk exists throughout the country, with moderate risk in deluxe accommodations. Community sanitation and food safety measures are generally inadequate. Some itineraries (e.g., remote destinations, austere accommodations) and activities (e.g., ecotourism, eating street or local-market food) further increase risk.

Other Food-Borne Illnesses: brucellosis

Insect- and Arthropod-Borne Diseases: bartonellosis, Chagas' disease (American trypanosomiasis), dengue, leishmaniasis, mayaro virus, West Nile virus, Zika

Other Disease and Health Risks: air pollution, altitude illness, anthrax disease, avian influenza, helminths, leptospirosis, marine hazards, plague, sexually transmitted infections, snakebites, tuberculosis

Chemoprophylaxis: some travelers

Notable risk areas: most areas east of the Andes and certain municipalities of Esmeraldas and Carchi provinces

No chemoprophylaxis needed: major cities, including Quito, Guayaquil, Cuenca, and Otavalo; the Galapagos Islands; Cañar Province: areas above 1,500 m

Drug options: A-P, DOX, MQ, TQ
